Bylaws Meeting December 14, 2020

- The Zoom meeting was hosted by Wendy Marshall of Fishnet New Media. Time was allocated by Wendy to assist with any technical issues that participants might encounter.
- Meeting began at 5:00 pm. There were approximately forty members in attendance plus Wendy Marshall, our Media Host.
- Agenda items were attended by Linda Coven & Pat Vigliorolo, Co-Presidents of The Cape Cod Hydrangea Society.
- New members in attendance were asked to virtually raise their hands. As Wendy called on each new member individually, they unmuted and introduced themselves & told us a little about themselves. There were 10 new members present.
- A request was presented to the floor for a vote on the Amended Bylaws of August 30, 2020. The Amendments were accomplished by the joint efforts of the CCHS Board as well as Past presidents. These had been distributed to the General Membership on October 20, 2020, in keeping with the required 30 day notice with time for perusal before voting. The Amended bylaws were unanimously approved by all those in attendance.
